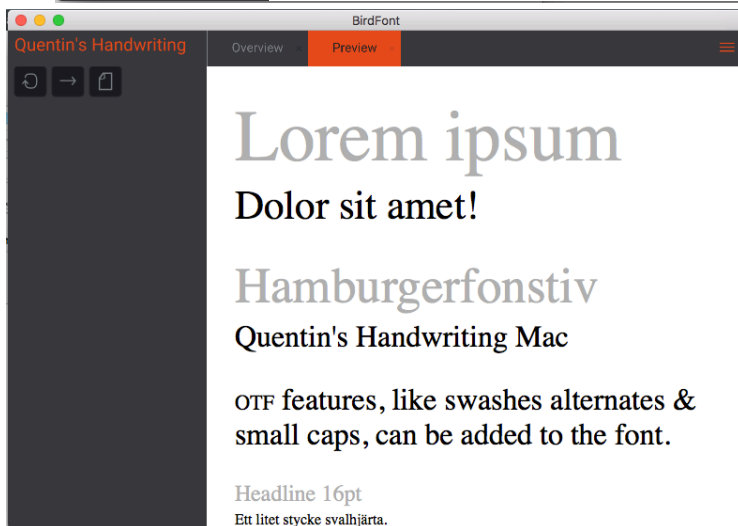
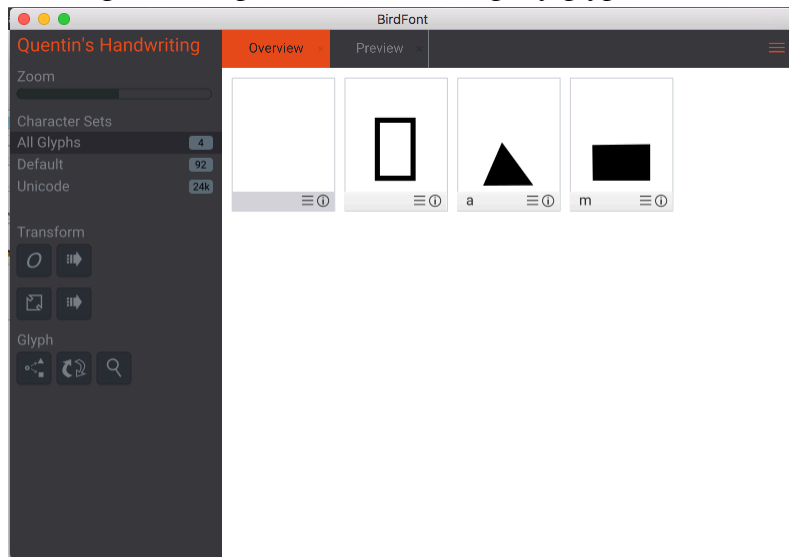
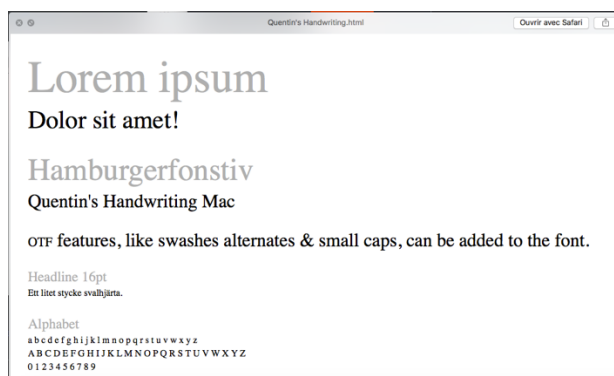


Hello,

I have a bug with the preview not showing my glyphs.



After some research, I found the generated HTML file, which, when I open it, shows the same issue.



After opening that HTML I found where the problem was.

The `'` in my font's name was messing with the ones in the code:

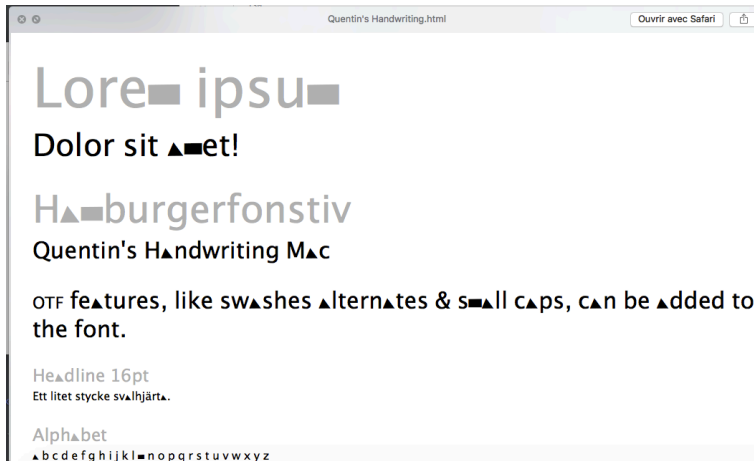

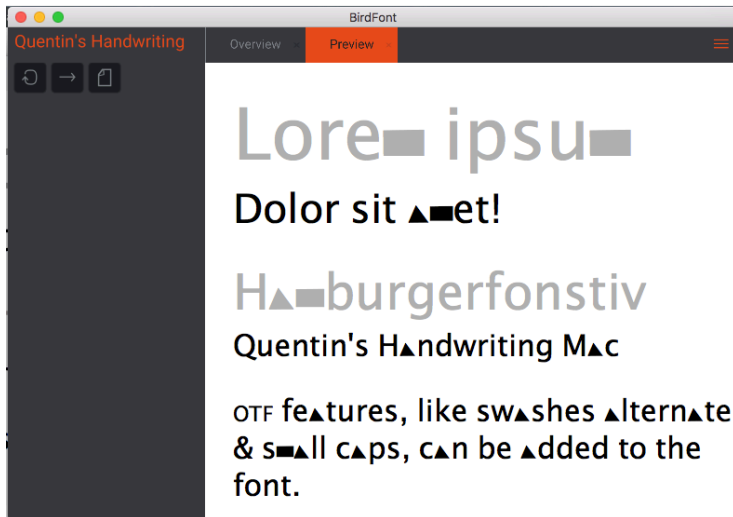
